
The census reached a major milestone with over **1000 participants** having taken part in Nelson Bay censuses since they started in December 2013.


The next census will be a week-long extravaganza (24th November-3rd December 2023) to celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the Nelson Bay Sea Slug Census!

It will overlap with the Great Southern BioBlitz (24-27th Nov.) and the 40th Anniversary celebrations for the Fly Pt-Halifax Park Aquatic Reserve (3rd Dec.).

Fun Fact: The first ever sea slug census was held in Nelson Bay in December 2013. The concept has spread from this original idea and censuses have now been held throughout NSW and in Victoria, Queensland, Western Australia, Vanuatu and Bali!

The following pages shows all the species found on the census in order from most to least common. Numbers in brackets refer to the number of team sightings. All photos were taken by the participants.

















Bubble and Umbrella shells
